

# ART HISTORY, CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT (C)

## Overview

The Certificate of Achievement in Art History provides students with the foundational knowledge in western and non-western art, from beginnings to contemporary art with a basic introduction to materials and techniques. The certificate requires students to complete two series of survey courses, and an art studio course to demonstrate a foundation of knowledge in the discipline.

This certificate prepares students to work or intern at art galleries, museums and other art venues, and festivals that have art components.

An Art History Certificate is a good liberal arts compliment to majors in Psychology, Communications, Literature, Sociology, Film Production, Theater, Political Science, Ethnic Studies, and more. It also shows breadth when combined with STEM majors. An Art History certificate is a highly regarded compliment to Studio Art majors of all types. Study of the Visual Arts is also a vocationally enriching and provides opportunity for lifelong personal enrichment.

## Requirements

Complete all Department Requirements for the Certificate of Achievement with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or better. Candidates for a Certificate of Achievement are required to complete at least 20% of the department requirements through SBCC.
